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

# What are they?

- **What is Interact?**
- **What is Rotaract?**

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Questions roll up one at a time. Discuss each as they come on the screen:

What is Interact?

A club for high school age students age 12-18. Always affiliated with a Rotary club. In 2021 there are:

14,911 clubs and 342,953 Interactors in 145 countries

What is Rotaract?

A club for young adults age 18 and up (no age out!!). NOT always affiliated with a Rotary club. A member can be a Rotaractor *and* a Rotarian at the same time. In 2022 there are:

10,698 Rotaract clubs with 203,298 members in 180 countries

# Why do we care?

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Ask the question – Why do we care? And collect answers, then ask What does your club look like? Let the pictures come in and then ask the last question – What will it look like in ten years? What about 20 years? Will your club still be here?

Rotary members must have a background check, talk to the district youth protection officer. You must have a school advisor (teacher, etc) and buy in from the school or organization (don't forget home schoolers!)

How is a Rotaract club different?

Rotaractors are over 18! Club can be school or community based

Where can clubs be created?

Anywhere.

How many clubs can you sponsor?

How many can you support with your time, talent & treasure?

How do you find members?

Discuss PR, very similar to club PR
